#### Definition

Academic Integrity is the acknowledgement of the sources of your work. Without acknowledgement, through referencing or bibliography, you are claiming the work as your own.

#### Philosophy

At CVPS, learning and applying the principles and skills of academic integrity in the primary years is fundamental to developing as an IB learner and becoming responsible global citizens. Being principled, honest, trustworthy, fair, respectful and responsible are central to the culture of our entire school community.

Academic integrity is developed through the Approaches to Learning, (communication, research, social, self-management and thinking skills) and through the articulation of clear understandings and expectations shown through the CVPS Scope and Sequence. (Appendix)

#### School Leadership Expectations and Responsibilities

To ensure:

- that academic integrity is valued
- that our commitment to academic integrity is communicated to the whole school community
- that the scope and sequence is clearly articulated and tracked
- that new staff, students and families share our commitment to academic integrity
- that deliberate breaches of academic integrity are thoroughly investigated and viewed as an opportunity for growth with reference to the Transgression Flow Chart (Appendix 2)

#### Staff Expectations and Responsibilities

To ensure:

- that they understand and are committed to developing a culture of academic integrity
- that the principles of academic integrity are understood and valued by students and families
- that the scope and sequence is embedded within the learning opportunities and continually built upon
- that deliberate breaches of academic integrity are thoroughly investigated and viewed as an opportunity for growth with reference to the Transgression Flow Chart (Appendix 2)

#### Students Expectations and Responsibilities

To ensure:

- that they are committed to upholding high standards of academic integrity
- that all work is completed honestly and fairly to demonstrate their own knowledge and understanding
- that they understand whether it is appropriate to work independently or collaboratively
- that the work of others is respected and correctly acknowledged

#### Parents/Caregivers

To ensure:

- that academic integrity is valued and understood
- that they are committed to upholding high standards of academic integrity


# Appendix 1: Scope and Sequence CVPS Developing Academic Integrity and Research Skills

In order to develop student capability in terms of academic integrity the following should be embedded within the learning opportunities and continually reviewed and built upon.


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### Appendix 2: Flow chart for transgressions
